Our House provides the working homeless—families and individuals—with safe, clean, comfortable housing; food; free child care; education; and job training in order that they may return to independence and lead productive lives.

The Shelter is one of the many programs available to Our House clients and is often the first program our clients use. The Shelter has two large dormitories: one for men and one for women and children. The Shelter also includes free laundry facilities, a kids' playroom, a common room, a dining area, and a commercial kitchen. Outside are a large playground, a family area, and a garden. Shelter residents have access to all of Our House's programs and services.

The Shelter



For openings and availability, please contact the Shelter at 501-374-7383 x1 and speak with a Shelter Supervisor or Intake Coordinator. Intakes are conducted on a first-come-first-served basis, and bed openings are never held.

To be eligible for entry into the Shelter, a client must:

- Be homeless
- Be willing and able to work full-time
- Be at or below 50% of the area median income

The Shelter also serves clients with special needs including people with disabilities, people recovering from drugs and alcohol, victims of domestic violence, and people exiting jail or prison.

The Program

The Our House Shelter program serves homeless individuals and families. The Shelter consists of 40 beds for men and 40 beds for women and children both in a dormitory-style layout. The Shelter provides basic needs such as shelter, food, and clothing as well as supportive services such as access to free child care, the Adult Learning Center, life skills classes, substance abuse meetings, mental health groups, personal enrichment classes, and other specific needs a homeless individual or family may have. Each Shelter resident gets individualized case management services to connect them to resources they may need. A Shelter client is required to work full-time, save money, contribute with chores and other duties, and work on the factors that led them to become homeless.
